Best Practices -2012-2013

"JAGAR JANIWANCHA": POSTER AND RANGOLI EXHIBITION ON FEMALE FETICIDE

The main objective of this practice is to create awareness about the female feticide and decrease in male female ratio.

As per 2011 census, child sex ratio in Maharashtra is 894 (913 in 2001), one of the lowest in India. More strikingly the child sex ratio in Ahmednagar District is 852 (884 in 2001) and mere 807 (894 in 2001) in adjacent Beed district as per 2011 census. This horrific decline in child sex ratio is due to social tendency and prejudice to have male child. Female feticide is very common practice and nobody thinks it as immoral. The nexus between public in general and the PNDT centers makes this practice accepted.

The College organized poster and *rangoli* exhibition to highlight the fall in female birth rate. The reason of this phenomenon is nothing but the Pre Natal Determination Test conducted by unauthorized Radiology centers and immoral practice by Medical Practitioners. Also, societal concepts for have male child engraves this situation. The youth studying in college today plays very important role in propagating good ideas and hence creating awareness among them will help in creating future society based on better moral ideology.

The students were briefed on the above topic, on which they already have some rough ideas through newspapers and television. They were presented the demographic details of the region with the help of 2001 and 2011 census. Then they were asked to gather their ideas regarding the presentation of the problem and the ways in which awareness can be created among the people.

It is found that challenging social prejudices is tough task. It is also found difficult to work on socially very sensitive issues. It is also found that it takes lot of effort and time to motivate people towards social change. The student participation in this activity was very limited.

The college has to invite expertise on the issue to brief students on this issue. The motivational and informative lecture was arranged. Students discussed on themes and ideas for posters with teachers and in groups. Student participants were asked to produce their own material for posters and rangoli.

Best Practices -2012-2013

"MAHARASHTRACHI LOKDHARA": PRESENTATION OF MAHARASHTRA'S FOLK ART

This activity is undertaken to present the traditional performing arts of Maharashtra which are not practiced in the context of modern electronic and cyber media. The aim of this activity is to introduce students to such arts like *Potraj, Bharud, Kadaklaxmi*, traditional folk songs etc.

Maharashtra has rich cultural heritage deeply rooted in Bhakti, Mahanubhav and Folk culture. These arts are practiced by limited number of people on limited occasions. The previous generations has been acquainted to these arts, but unfortunately our generation has not been exposed to these performances on larger scale. Therefore, the college decided to promote its students to understand and perform these folk arts, as well to bring out the potential of students regarding their love for performing arts.

This activity was planned by cultural activities department of the college. First of all the area for this programme i.e. the performances to be presented were decided. After selecting programmes as *Powada* (ballad to celebrate the legends), *Potraj* (traditional dancers who perform to please deities), dance of *Dhangaras* (the herdsmen), *Gawlan Nrutya* (traditional dance by the milk women), *Lawani* (traditional dance form of Maharashtra), Tribal Dance, Street plays, *Bharud* (didactic poetic form developed by Sant Eknath of 16th century), *Gondhal Geet* (dance song to celebrate and please Goddess), *Vasudev Geet* (dance song), etc., students were briefed about the traditions behind these forms.

In order to understand the history and traditions behind these performances, the teachers explained every detail about it. External expert Mr. Urshile, local dance teacher was invited for the rehearsal of dances. Mr. Ayyub Pathan, local musician was invited to give the musical background to songs. After the rehearsal of two weeks, the final performances were made in front of the college students, Principal, teachers, parents and the management of the college.

The performances were very successful and students of the next academic year demanded for the repetition of the programmes again. The programme was appreciated by spectators, and got wide publicity. The team of performers was selected for participation in university level meet.
